



CRAIN'S RECOGNIZES DORIT UNGAR BLACK ON 2020 NOTABLE WOMEN IN LAW LIST

New York—Dorit Ungar Black, a founding partner of Holwell Shuster & Goldberg LLP, has been named to *Crain's New York Business'* 2020 Notable Women in Law list. According to *Crain's*, this year's list recognizes 100 “dedicated, gifted and determined female lawyers” from the New York City metro area.

Crain's highlighted Dorit's lead role in putting on a multibillion-dollar damages case in a recent trial against Lehman Brothers over its massive securitizations of toxic mortgages. The trial, which addressed Lehman's pivotal role in causing the 2008 financial collapse, resulted in a \$2.4 billion damages award for investors—the largest single trial verdict resulting from the housing crisis. *Crain's* also noted Dorit's current work involving innovative, multimillion-dollar litigation against insurance carriers concerning improper Cost of Insurance rate increases.
