HOLWELL SHUSTER & GOLDBERG COMMEMORATES FRED KOREMATSU WITH SUPREME COURT REENACTMENT

red Korematsu was a national civil rights hero. In 1942, at the age of 23, he refused to go to the government's incarceration camps for Japanese Americans. After he was arrested and convicted of defying the government's Executive Order 9066, he appealed his case all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court. Memorializing the plight of Japanese Americans, each year Fred Korematsu Day of Civil Liberties and the Constitution honors the legacy of Korematsu and his fight for racial equity, social justice, and human rights for all.

In commemoration of a man President Clinton referred to as "an ordinary American who took an extraordinary stand," Holwell Shuster & Goldberg's Asian Equality Taskforce hosted a very special CLE program on Korematsu's personal story, including a background on Executive Order 9066, along with related military orders, proclamations, and laws.

The unique program used storylines, videos, arguments, and realistic backgrounds to create an immersive experience remotely via Zoom. Led by a full cast of HSG lawyers and professional staff, the event culminated with a reenactment of the Korematsu Supreme Court case and a discussion of the subsequent legal developments. Founding partners Daniel Goldberg and Michael Shuster argued the case before Supreme Court Justices played by Neil Lieberman, Margot Hoppin, and Denisha Bacchus, embracing the challenge of taking on difficult and sensitive arguments.

Although a CLE, this event was open to everyone at the firm. The audience included over 70 HSG attorneys, professionals, and other colleagues.
